

BOOK REVIEW

Explore St. Mark's Coptic Museum, An Illustrated Introduction Helene Moussa

In this small book Helene Moussa has set out to provide an overview of the collection at St. Mark's Museum. But the end result is much more than that. In providing a historical account she has also confirmed that Coptic Culture is a living, thriving, ever developing cultural force. She points out how artists of the past have often recognized the links with their Pharaonic past through to the overlay from "external" rulers and the influences each of them has brought. Yet the Coptic element remains dominant and recognizable for the most part.

The book is divided into fourteen chapters by media, acknowledging the difficulty of doing that in some cases. For example should icons be kept as a separate unit, or included with paintings? Should crosses be isolated as a distinct category of object, or included with metal, wood, ivory? And if you do that with crosses do you do the same for censers?

This sounds simple, but organizing this material is a major step before starting to write. Each chapter at first glance, is an outline of the museum's holdings in that category of object. But one soon realizes that each chapter is also a clear scholarly overview of the topic, with sufficient references to allow anyone to delve further into the topic. In fact, each chapter could well serve as the outline for a seminar —be it on pilgrimage vessels, textiles, or the work of individual artists of the nineteenth or twentieth century. So what at first appears to be yet another museum catalogue is in reality an imminently readable work which not only gives a good overview of the museum's holdings, it also provides the scholarly framework for further study for anyone who might wish to do so. Nor is it a dry listing of facts about each object; it is an interpretive narrative which turns out to be a good read. I recommend it.
